ROBERT D. HALL TO LECTURE ON DEDHAM'S PRAYING INDIANS MAY 13

Robert D. Hall, historian and author, will present *The Praying Indians of Dedham*, Thursday, May 13, 2010, 7:30 PM at the Society museum/auditorium. The cost is \$5, with no charge for members. Hall will tell the history of John Eliot's first establishment of a home for those American Indians he converted to Christianity, educated, and "civilized" on a tract of land carved out of Dedham and located in what are today portions of Natick, Dover, Wellesley, and Needham.

Hall is a resident of Needham where he now serves as a member of the Needham Historical Commission and as Needham Historical Society Historian and Editor of its newsletter, "The NHS Gazette," for which he has written nearly 100 essays on the history of Needham and environs, including the Indian Lands.

DHS SPRING HOUSE TOUR MAY 23

The DHS House Tour will take place on Sunday, May 23, 2010 from 12 noon to 3:45 pm. Advance purchase tickets are available at the Dedham Historical Society, \$16 for members and \$20 for non-members. The tour features six private historic houses, representing a variety of architectural styles built during the 18th and 19th centuries. These lovely homes show how historic homes can be sensitively adapted for contemporary living. The tour will also include the historic Fairbanks House, the oldest timber frame home in New England, built in circa 1640. Most of the homes are located within a short walking distance of one another and tea will be served at one of the homes. Join us and explore various house designs including Federal, Greek Revival, Colonial Revival, Italianate, and Shingle Style.

The DHS social event of the year, the Annual Soirée, will take place on Saturday, May 22 at 93 Village Avenue. This is a unique opportunity to visit an extraordinary 1895 house while supporting the DHS. The Worthington Committee is hard at work creating an elegant evening you don't want to miss.

Built by local builder, C. J. Wilfson, many elements of the late nineteenth century "Shingle Style" are evident in this classic villa. The grand stairway to the upper levels spills into the central circulation space from a mid-stair landing with fully glazed window wall, flooding the hallway below with natural daylight.
